AP Music Theory Group Tutoring

Student Terms & Requirements

Summary

This class serves students preparing to take the AP Theory exam through their home institution. Students will identify their strengths and weaknesses, and reinforce skills through practice and activities. Topics covered include scales, chords, modes, harmony, voice leading, and form.

Textbook requirement

Barron's AP Music Theory, 4th Edition by Nancy Fuller Scoggin. ISBN 978-1506264097.

Technical requirements

- Computer (laptop or desktop)
- Stable broadband internet access
- Webcam
- Speakers or headphones
- Microphone, or headphones with a built- in microphone
- Scanner or scanner app
- Metronome or metronome app
- Staff paper and pencil

Please note that professional notation software such as Sibelius, Finale, or Dorico is not required but students are welcome to use it if they are comfortable. We are unable to provide technical assistance with this software.

Schedule

This class will meet once per week for 55 minutes over Zoom (the specific day and time will depend on the section). Classes begin February 13, 2023 and end May 12, 2023. No classes will be held March 25-31.



Age Requirement

Students must be at least 13 years of age to enroll.

Activities and Expectations

In our classes, students will participate in a range of activities including group and individual projects, synchronous and asynchronous online communication with their peers, workshops, class discussions, in-class singing, listenings, keyboard exercises, and other activities determined by class interest. Students can expect to average about two hours a week on out-of-class activities.

Our classes tend to be hands-on and experientially oriented. Activities in class require students to 1) have completed their out of class assignments, 2) have adequate equipment (see list of technical requirements), 3) be punctual, and 4) be an active participant. To ensure the best results, students are expected to attend and participate in every class



meeting. If students miss any part of class for any reason, students are asked to come to office hours, and we will help you catch up on any assignments or information from class.
